SIVA's holistic relationship-based model effectively utilizes collaboration, goal-direction, self-management and healthy empowerment to strengthen relationships and create safety. Thousands of professionals and caregivers have embraced the SIVA model as their training program of choice. SIVA has been described as "a refreshing alternative to crisis focused programs." - Emergency Safety Interventions for those situations that present an imminent risk of harm to self or others
- Post interventions Management through environmental safety, debriefing and incident report writing
