Colton came to Safer Schools Together in 2016 after receiving his Diploma in Law Enforcement Studies at the Justice Institute of BC. As a member of the Safer Schools Together team, Colton specializes in Social Media Awareness and publicly available information gathering. As a trainer, he presents to police officers, school staff, parents, and students on social media awareness, cyberbullying, and online safety.
